Parent Forum responses

Can dates for the academic year be shared in advance for events such as nativities and sports days?

Wherever possible we aim to give you as much notice as possible to attend events involving your children. Most of the time these are at least at the beginning of the term. There are occasions where we have the opportunity to add something to the diary at the last minute and don't want the children to miss out. We want you to share in your child's education and will continue to share these dates as soon as we have them.

We are concerned with the impact of SATS, particularly on yr 5. We know this is a challenge of a double year classroom, but it has felt like there is a strong emphasis on SATS preparation across the whole class and have affected XXX's experience of school negatively, despite not

Whilst SATs are an important part of the school year we don't believe that they should negatively affect a child's education whether they are in year 6 or year 5. I think that this feedback is vital in helping us improve our classroom practice. To support this we will be increasing the amount of pupil conferencing next year to further understand and listen to the children's feedback.

Moving forward to the new school year in September, who will be replacing Mrs Whitelegg teaching in Ladoca on Thursdays and Fridays?

Also will the children have a permanent T.A?

Class lists including support staff have now been shared with parents.

Will there be any further outside learning available for the children.. I.e forest school?

This year forest school has focused on KS1 and Early years but next year will be incorporated into the curriculum for the rest of the school.

Whilst I understand that numbers of pupils at clubs can be an issue - would it be possible to have some bespoke Reception clubs?

After school clubs is always difficult and has been in any school I have worked in. Close attention is paid to the clubs that have the greatest attendance and are the most successful so that we know that we are offering the right clubs for the right children. With only 5 children in reception this year it was important to offer a club that would involve a wider audience. We are looking at new partnerships next year to increase the number of clubs on offer.

Could we have more focus and support on internet safety, maybe a training event for parents taking us through how to set safety controls for children?

Internet safety is a huge focus in school and was the subject of a number of changes in Keeping Children Safe in Education last year. This has led to us improving our firewall and software to monitor the access the children have. Now not only are they blocked from seeing anything they shouldn't but if they attempt to access or type anything inappropriate it is reported to myself. We will look at putting a session or sharing more information on how you can keep your children safe at home in the new year.

Thank you for the questions send in we will give the opportunity to do so again in the Autumn term.

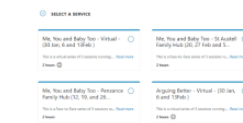
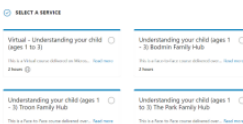
