A note from Mr Stoyles

We are pleased to introduce 'The 99 Club' throughout the school. This will aim to further raise standards in maths through encouraging pupils to improve their mental calculations when attempting quick-fire multiplication, division, addition and subtraction problems.

The idea is that with repeated practice, the scheme will result in an increased speed and confidence when tackling mental maths problems, without relying on written workings and methods.

Pupils will work their way up, having an opportunity each week to answer all calculations at their current level unaided, and within an allotted time.

To publicise the importance of times tables, as well as recognising effort and celebrating success with children as they progress through the 99 club, every child will receive a certificate after they reach each milestone.

Below is a table to explain the '99 Club' programme we will be using with the children. Children in the infants will also take part in the 99 club with a slightly different version, based on the objectives from their year group. They will however still be able to progress through the stages of the club.

<u>66 Club</u>	Multiplication and division (5 minutes)
<u>77 Club</u>	Mixed division and multiplication (5 minutes)
<u>88 Club</u>	Random 4 operations (5 minutes)
<u>99 Club</u>	Fractions, Decimals and percentages (10 minutes)
<u>99+ Club</u>	Square/cubed numbers, algebra, FDP, square roots, deci- mal problems (5 minutes)

Please find below a paragraph from the e-mail which Steve Marshall (Transport Officer at Cornwall Council) has sent the bus companies:-

"Buses will allow access to the Year 6's with the usual caveats:

There is no guarantee that any/all of the new intake will be able to get on the bus. The Council have no obligation to provide transport for open days so it's just something we help out with. If the vehicle becomes overloaded, then they will be refused access. As a result of the above, we advise all parents to accompany the Year 6's to the bus stop nearest to their house/in their village, in case they are refused access".
