I know....it is still summer and we are already thinking about Christmas!

Year 6 Parents

I am sure you do not want to be reminded that your child is in their last year of primary education but you will have received your application booklet for a place at secondary school by now so there is no escaping it! There will be a transition meeting on **Tuesday 20th September** in St Blaise class for year 6 parents and children. Members of staff and ex Ladock pupils from The Roseland will come down to talk to you about the transition and answer any questions you might have. This is a very useful meeting to attend and helps to reassure children who might be feeling a little anxious.

There is also an open evening at The Roseland on **Tuesday 27th September** which is open to parents of year 5 and 6 children. This gives children and parents the opportunity to have a look around and take part in some activities.

The date for the year 6s moving on to the Roseland to go up and visit for the day is the **27**th **June 2017**. This is followed by a parents' evening at 6.30pm at The Roseland.

School Uniform Information reminder

The uniform is not going to be changed; we would just like to narrow down some of the choices so that our children look more like they all belong to the Ladock team. We do not expect parents to have to discard any uniform as the new rules will not come in until **September 2017** which will hopefully give you all chance to be prepared. That said, I am sure many of you will be ordering new uniform, so will want to take the new guidelines on board.

Uniform from September 2017:

- Dark grey tailored shorts or trousers for boys and girls
- Or dark grey skirts or pinafores for girls
- ♦ White polo shirts with or without the school logo
- Red sweatshirts WITH the school logo (no fleeces or hoodies)
- Or red cardigans **WITH** the school logo for girls
- Tights for girls must be red or grey
- Grey or white socks must be worn with shorts/skirts/dresses
- Girls may wear red and white checked summer dresses
- ◆ Closed toe, black shoes must be worn (**NO TRAINERS**)
- ◆ PE uniform Plain black shorts/jogging bottoms, plimsolls/trainers, round necked red t-shirt with school logo

Uniform Ordering from Tesco

- 1. Go to tesco.com/ues
- 2. Select your school uniform from the list and you'll see all the customised items you can buy.
- 3. Choose the quantity and sizes you'd like, then add them to your basket.
- 4. Pay easily with a debit or credit at the checkout.
- 5. Your embroidered items will be delivered within 14 days, free delivery for orders over £15.

Free School Meals and Pupil Premium

Please can we remind you that children eligible for free school meals can also qualify for additional funding known as Pupil Premium which can allow the school to subsidise various trips as well as funding educational opportunities. Even if your child is in KS1 so already receives a free school meal, it could still be beneficial to apply for Free School Meals.

Qualifying Benefits

- * Income support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance (not contribution based)
- * Income-related Employment & Support Allowance (not Contribution based)
- * Child Tax Credit (CTC) with an annual income (as shown on your award letter from the Inland Revenue—TC602) of no more that £16,190.
- * Guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- * Support via Part VI of the Immigration & Asylum Act 1999 (IAA)

Please note, if you are in receipt of Working Tax Credit, you do **NOT** qualify for Free School Meals, even if your annual income is below £16,190.

Applications will be processed within 3 working days.

Starting School—September 2017

Do you have a child born between 1st September 2012 and 31st August 2013, if so, you need to apply for a school place for September 2017.

Nursery children will receive a leaflet explaining how to apply for a place, further copies available in the school office.

The on-line application system is now open and can be accessed at www.cornwall.gov.uk/admissions. A downloadable copy of the full information booklet is also available from the web pages.

The deadline for applications is 15th January 2017

<u>Transfer to Secondary School—September 2017</u>

All of our Year 6 children have been given a leaflet explaining how to apply for a secondary school in September 2017, if not, please ask in the school office.

The deadline for applications is 31st October 2016

Online payments to school with ParentPay

ParentPay is the St Pirans Cross system used for booking and paying for school lunches and wraparound care. All other payments such as residential trips and swimming monies etc will also need to be paid via ParentPay.

Making secure payments online using your credit or debit card

ParentPay offers you the freedom to make payments whenever and wherever you like, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week - safe in the knowledge that the technology used is of the highest internet security available.

You will have a secure online account, activated using a unique username and password; you will be prompted to change these, and to keep them safe and secure. If you have more than one child at our school, or children at another ParentPay school, you can create one single account login for all your children regardless of which school they attend.

Making a payment is straightforward and ParentPay holds a payment history for you to view at a later date; no card details are stored in any part of the system. Once you have activated your account you can make online payments straight away.

Making payment by cash or cheque

We will continue to accept cash and cheque payments in school, although the trust and school's future vision is to become totally cashless from Monday 31st October 2016 and to encourage all parents to use the parentpay facility. Please make cheques payable to St Piran's Cross Multi-Academy Trust. Cash and cheque payments are also recorded in your ParentPay online account, giving you a record of all payments you have made to school regardless of which method you use. This means you will no longer receive a written receipt for the payments logged on ParentPay.

If you need your unique ParentPay Account activation details, please speak to Jane in the office.

Ordering and paying for school meals

From Monday 26th September a new system for ordering and paying for school lunches will be introduced. You will be able to book your meal option and pay online through Parentpay. For Key Stage 1 parents who have free meals or for any other children receiving free school meals you will also need to choose your menu option through parentpay, although no payment will be required. Payment will be required prior to a meal being ordered. We realise there will be come circumstances when an emergency may arise and the school will support these odd occasions.

After School and Breakfast club procedures

From Monday 26th September a new system will also be in place for booking and paying for wraparound care. There will be cut off points for booking a place which will be introduced, midday on the day before the breakfast club sessions and midnight the day before for the after school club sessions. We realise there will be some circumstances when an emergency may arise and the school will support these odd occasions. You will no longer be able to use the facility unless this is booked and paid for in advance and the school is unable to offer any credit facility.

Wraparound prices

A 50% discount will be offered for additional siblings attending the club and this will be refunded back to you. Full payment will be required at the time of booking, but you will see this altered by the school office and credited back to your parentpay 'my account'.

ParentPay FAQs

When can I log in to my account?

Once you have received your activation letter from school with your activation login details you will be able to activate your account and start making payments.

Which cards can I use?

ParentPay accepts MasterCard, Visa and American Express credit cards, and Maestro, Switch, Delta, Electron, Solo and Visa debit cards. Some schools may limit the use of credit cards for some transactions; you will be informed by the school directly of any such restrictions.

Is it safe to make payments on the internet?

Yes. ParentPay uses leading technology to process your card transactions securely. All communication with the bank is encrypted and neither ParentPay nor the school have access to your card details.

How can I check that it's secure?

Standard website addresses begin with http: the address for a secure site will always begin with https. You will also see a padlock at the bottom/top right of the screen on our login page and after you have logged into your account; never enter your card details or personal data on any web page whose address does not start https.

What about our personal information?

ParentPay holds a very limited amount of information about you and your child solely for the purpose of administering your account however; ParentPay does not use your personal information other than for supporting the school. We do not share or give information to any other organisations. We operate under strict guidelines set out by the Data Protection Act 1998.

ParentPay will NEVER contact you by phone, email or mail and ask you to divulge confidential information like passwords or card numbers. If you are ever contacted by someone claiming to be from ParentPay, please contact us immediately on 02476 994 820.

I do not have a home PC so how can I use ParentPay?

ParentPay does open on to a phone device to allow you to quickly access what you have ordered and paid for. Why not visit your local library, internet café or see if you can get access to a computer at work. Alternatively ask if you can use your school's computers.
