Parentpay booking system reminder

Please remember that you are asked to book your child's school meals on the Parentpay system from next week—Monday 26th September. Booking selections will be printed off at 8.30 each morning, so please ensure you have made your bookings before that time. Payment will be required at the time of booking. KS1 children and children entitled to free school meals will also need to choose their menu options through Parentpay, although no payment will be required.

Breakfast and after school clubs also need to be booked on Parentpay. Cut off points for breakfast club will be midday on the day before the session and after school club will be 8.30am on the day of the session.

Parent Forum

Many thanks to those parents who were able to attend the parent forum on Friday 16th September. There is no agenda for these meetings but they prove an invaluable opportunity to have an open discussion about what is going well, what could be better and answer any queries. The topics discussed last Friday were as follows:

1) Top corner of playground:

A suggestion was made that we contact CBeebies to investigate the possibility of Mr Bloom's television show visiting our school to help us develop the top corner of the playground behind the Maori Longhouse. Ben Faulkes who plays Mr Bloom originates from Cornwall so there are some connections to explore.

2) Nursery:

It was suggested that some nursery children might prefer to be given the opportunity to go straight into St Cuby class in the mornings as some find the playground a little intimidating first thing. Mrs Michell thought this was a good idea and will discuss with St Cuby class staff to check that this would work.....more details to follow.

A request was made that nursery children could bring their own fruit into school for their breaktime snack. Mrs Michell will check on procedures in St Cuby class to see if this would work and get back to parents.

3) Car Park:

With the increase in numbers the car park is getting increasingly full. A suggestion was made that parents could park directly behind the staff's cars to create an extra row. A request was put in the newsletter last week for parents to create two rows in the middle of the car park so it was suggested that we wait to see if this has a positive impact, if not, we will try the row behind staff cars plan.

4) Wrap Around Payments:

Concerns were expressed about the new plans to book and pay for wraparound provision using Parent Pay. The main concerns were as follows:

Parents will stop using Breakfast Club and After school Club because they are not always in a position to book in advance.

Not everyone has access to the internet and this might include children who are entitled to Pupil Premium funding.

Sometimes internet access is temporarily suspended.

It was unclear how far in advance lunches must be booked.

It is not unusual for after school sports clubs to be cancelled, what would then happen about payment.

It is extra work for Admin. staff

Mrs Michell reassured parents that it is fine to book clubs last minutes when necessary due to a change in circumstances. She also explained the Pay point situation and advised of the nearest Pay points. A letter went home after the Parent Forum meeting which answered some questions and explained that the Trust had delayed going cashless until 2017 now. Further clarity will be sought on other points.
