

South West British Youth Fencing Competition

After several hours, we started the DES (standing for deliberate elimination). If you were to lose a match in these, you would be out. I won my way up to the final against an experienced fencer. As the match went on it became a tense 9:9 in the score. After a daring lunge, I took the final point and won gold! This victory let me qualify for the BYC's (British Youth Championships). I was surprised when I got into the final, and even more when I realised I had won! It was really fun, and the BYCs/ Nationals will be up in Sheffield in May. I highly encourage trying fencing, it's great fun, and you can make lots of new friends too.



FOOTBALL ROADSHOW

Our Soccer Roadshows are age and football specific with the emphasis on fun, enjoyment and development. Sessions include skills, techniques, competitions and small sided games.
