A busy week at Ladock that started with our first school improvement visit for a considerable amount of time. Paul Hodson (Ofsted inspector) arrived at school with the intention to quality assure our school documentation and review teaching practice across the school with a focus on children with special educational needs. We're proud to share some of his feedback and recommendations.

## Cuby

"The children were very happy to talk about their activities and every child was playing with a purpose and working well with others."
"The outdoor spaces are particularly well arranged, offering children opportunities to develop fine and large motor skills. There were opportunities for writing, developing an understanding of early number and activities to introduce all of the areas of learning."

## Keyne

Pupils in Years 1 and 2 were all engaged in analysing non-fiction texts. This was a challenging and exciting activity where they could choose a nonfiction book and then find features. They were doing this well and showing good moral and social development as the worked together and shared their findings.

## Ladoca

Scrutiny of mathematics books shows that the pupils have covered the expected curriculum and followed clear sequences of lessons. The workbooks demonstrate good attitudes to learning.
Pupils in this class are making good progress and taking pride in their work. Pupils with SEND are accessing the whole curriculum and lessons are adapted to support them where needed

## Blaise

Pupils in key stage 2 have good instant recall of declarative mathematical knowledge, including times tables. This is because teachers provide regular practise and also use IT programmes and weekly tests.
Pupils in Years 5 and 6 were working well and were willing to talk about their learning.

Scrutiny of mathematics books shows that the teacher has carefully sequenced learning and given the pupils time to master concepts before moving on.

## Areas for development noted:

Ensure that the school website is compliant with all policies up to date Ensure that the class pages on the school website show consistency in terms of shared curriculum plans and examples of pupils' work

Consider collating information of how all subjects are adapted to support pupils with different needs.

Continue to develop the curriculum in history and science to show clear sequencing of learning in lessons.

On Tuesday the children in Ladoca class visited the National Maritime Museum as part of their topic, 'Invaders and Settlers' where they took part in a variety of different workshops. The children thoroughly enjoyed themselves, especially in the 'monsters of the deep' exhibition. Their behaviour was impeccable throughout and a special thank you to Mrs

## What is the School Monitoring Council's Role?

The function of the SMCs is to contribute to school improvement by holding to account the Heads of School for their effectiveness in addressing agreed improvement priorities. ## Covid-19

This week has been our most challenging week for cases across the school. We calculate $7.6 \%$ of our school roll testing positive for Covid-19 alongside 1 member of staff. Although this changes daily, the average for school covid related absence is currently at around $12.6 \%$ nationally. The school will continue to open its doors, unless instructed otherwise, regardless of cases providing we can staff this appropriately. It has been widely reported that supply teaching agencies are currently struggling to meet staffing shortages in schools throughout Cornwall. A personal message a thanks need to go to our staff who have been adaptable, willing and committed to providing the best education for the children in school during complex circumstances. We wish all children and staff currently isolating a speedy recovery with minimal symptoms.
